Dear Prospective Preschool Parent

During Catholic Schools Week, it is traditional to extend the invitation for you to register your child for the next school year. I hope that you will consider sending your child to Holy Rosary Catholic School the 2010-11 school year. Please complete the enclosed registration form and return it to the school office by February 15th. Once your registration form is received, it is stamped with the arrival day and then placed in the file. In mid-February we will begin to create class rosters based on parent request and when the form arrived. For the 3-year-old program we cap enrollment at 10 students per section and for the 4-year-old program at 15 per class. Priority registration is given to returning students and those with siblings in the program currently.

For the 2010-11 school year our three year old program will be offered in 4 different sections.;

MWF	from 8 AM – 11 AM	\$500 per student base tuition
TTh	from 8 AM – 11 AM	\$450 per student base tuition
F	from 8 AM – 11 AM	\$400 per student base tuition
F	from Noon – 3 PM	\$400 per student base tuition

In addition, the preschool milk/snack fee is \$.50/day which equates to \$18 for the 1 day, \$36 for the 2 day or \$54 for the 3 day. For 2010-11 each family will also have a \$50 family scrip fee which is more fully explained on the enclosed scrip flyer.

Wrap around care is available at a cost of \$15 per day for those who pre-register for specific days each semester or \$20 for same day registration. Wrap around is available Monday – Friday from 11 AM – 6 PM and includes school lunch and afternoon snack/milk.

We pride ourselves on our program of instruction available here. The 3-year-old program will be taught again by Mrs. Dianna Nikkila and Ms. Carol Jahnsman. Ms. Jahnsman teaches the Friday AM section. Both of our preschool teachers have completed degrees in early childhood education and also attend regular professional development programs as well. We follow the Wisconsin model early childhood standards as well as those from the Diocese of Superior and use the same readiness assessment that MAPS uses for transitioning into Kindergarten at the end of the preschool program. The other aspect that we pride ourselves on is the ability to add in a religious dimension to the preschool dealing with an appreciation of God's work in creating the earth. We also work on basic prayers such as sign of the cross, prayer as talking to God and the idea of service to others. The preschool students do not normally attend Mass on a weekly basis but are involved if present during prayer services and other special events suited to their developmental level.
